The children were full of questions and came up with imaginative ideas about the items explaining and justifying their ideas. They made clay pots and decorated them just as Bronze Age people would have and explored the site learning so much about life back then.

Before coming back to the twenty first century we all gathered around the fire in the round house for an exciting story!

Church Schools Festival

On Wednesday, our Year 6 children travelled to Lincoln to visit the Cathedral and take part in the annual Church Schools' Festival.

They joined in with a choir workshop, learning actions along with the words; took part in a craft session creating stained glass window designs and making bookmarks; they completed a scavenger hunt searching out artifacts and information to learn the history of the cathedral, were challenged to build Gothic and Norman arches and enjoyed a little drama dressing up as priests.

The day culminated in a service where two of the children carried our school banner during the procession through the cathedral and another of our children was presented with a candle that we are now using in our daily Collective Worship.
