

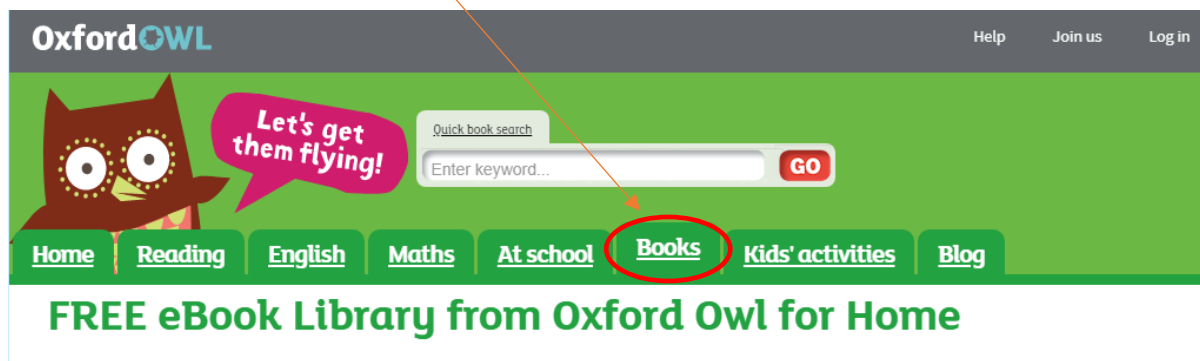
Federation Reading and Comprehension

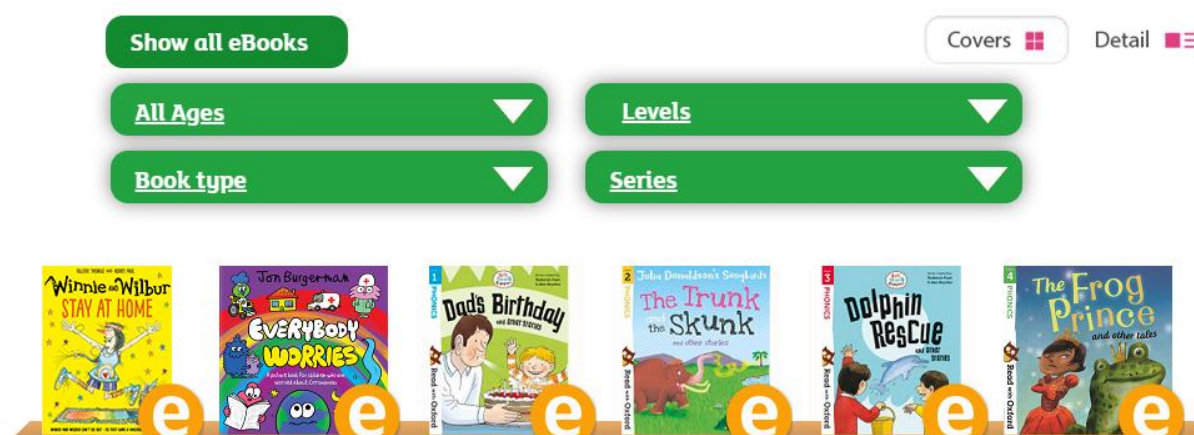

Weekly Comprehension

Usually the children in Key Stage 1 and 2 take part in daily guided reading lessons. While they are not in school, it would be great for every child to read everyday and to complete a written comprehension activity each week. The resources do include the answers so that you can mark them with your children or they can self-mark.

KS1 children would benefit from completing these comprehension activities with adult discussion, encouragement and support.
