Reading

Children are very busy writing their book reviews to earn rewards; a big thank you to all parents for supporting us with this. I have had many questions about the reading books children are taking home. The younger pupils in school have one book that is phonically decodable and another that is more challenging to share with an adult. The phonically decodable book will only have words in that the children are able to sound out or recognise from their phonics sessions up to now. The children are in differentiated groups for phonics and therefore your children may have different books to their friends.

Children progress at different speeds and it is important that the books we are sending home match where they are in school. The more advanced readers in school will be free readers and reading books appropriate to them. Mrs Barmby can help with suggested authors for those children who love one type of genre or a particular author but are coming to the end of their books. We really want to encourage and develop the children's love of reading.

Statutory Assessments

Below I have listed the key dates for statutory testing and which year groups this applies to. Year 2 pupils will take the tests over the whole of May; we can choose which day to administer the tests. Phonics screening happens in June for our Year 1 pupils and any Year 2s who did not achieve the working at score last year. Our Year 6 pupils have specific dates for their testing. These are also listed below. This year is the first year for the Year 4 multiplication check. This is taken online. All the results from these statutory assessments will be provided with your child's end of year report.

There will be an information evening for parents on **18th March** for all Year 6 parents.

Phonics Screening check is for Year 1 pupils and Year 2 pupils who were not assessed as working at in Year 1 last year. The Key Stage 1 test period is for all Year 2 pupils.

The multiplication check is for pupils in Year 4.

Multiplication tables check

Schools should administer the multiplication tables check within the 3 week period from Monday 8 June 2020. Schools are strongly encouraged to administer the check within the first 2 weeks, leaving sufficient time on the final week for pupils who were absent or in case of delays due to unforeseen issues such as technical difficulties.
